If you have an autistic sibling, it may be difficult for you to understand what they are going through, and how you can best support them. It may also be difficult for you to realise what support is available for you. The following resources are designed to provide information and highlight support opportunities.

Support for you:

Young Carers:

If you provide care for your sibling and are under 18 (25 in some areas), you can receive support as a young carer. Care doesn't have to be physical care and can include emotional or mental health support. Young carers groups provide emotional support, a chance to meet people in similar situations and opportunities to get involved in fun activities.
